THE CENTER FOR GLOBAL ENGAGEMENT

Leading intercultural learning and global academic initiatives by advancing the international exchange of students, scholars, and faculty.

The Center of Global Engagement provides activities, services and advising for study abroad students, international students, international faculty, researchers and scholars at the University of Maryland, Baltimore County (UMBC). We have undergraduate and graduate students from over 100 countries. Our faculty includes scholars from distinguished universities all over the world. Our growing international curriculum prepares our students for a rapidly changing and increasingly interdependent world. The following teams specialize in various fields to promote international education at UMBC:

The Education Abroad Office (EA) helps UMBC students find a summer, winter, semester or academic year study abroad programs to earn credits toward their UMBC degree while having a life-changing experience in dozens of countries around the world. The EA Office also oversees UMBC applications to the U.S. Fulbright Program, Gilman Scholarship, and other scholarship resources for study abroad.

The Office of International Students and Scholars (OISS) is dedicated to supporting UMBC's international student and scholar community. The office offers a variety of programming and services to assist students and scholars in pursuit of their academic, personal, and professional goals.

The English Language Institute (ELI) provides high quality training to those who need strengthen their English skills in speaking, listening, reading, writing, and/or grammar for their personal and professional goals. The programs include Intensive English Program (IEP), Academic English Program (AEP), TESOL, Test Prep (TOEFL, IELTS, and GRE), skill-focused training (e.g., Accent Reduction, Professional/Business Writing, Conversation Skills, etc.) and more. The ELI also facilitates internationalization at UMBC through **Special Programs** for international delegations.

In the Center for Global Engagement, the area of **International Partnerships** is the main point of contact for the partnerships that contribute to the work of the English Language Institute (ELI), Education Abroad, International Student & Scholar Services (ISSS), the Fulbright Program, and international research collaborations.


EDUCATION ABROAD



- find employment faster after graduation¹

Our Office is proud of our innovative model for supporting global learning at UMBC: students are supported in all aspects of their programs, including advising on program selection, predeparture training, and on-site support from UMBC faculty and affiliate partner staff. Our team is dedicated to assisting students with funding for their study finding abroad This programs and fellowships. comprehensive approach improves student outcomes upon their return to the the U.S. and increases their likelihood to embark on future Global Learning opportunities.

We aim to empower students to study abroad, cultivating global skills, boosting self-confidence, and improving academic and graduation outcomes.







UMBC Students Abroad AY22-23







SCHOLARSHIPS

With the support of the Education Abroad Office, **UMBC students and alumni have secured over \$340,000** towards their programs abroad through Fulbright awards and study abroad scholarships.

UMBC's Center for Global Engagement received a grant of \$10,000 from the The Sir Cyril Taylor Memorial Scholarship, administered by the American International Recruitment Council, to support incoming British exchange students from UMBC's partner institutions, Swansea University and the University of Newcastle. These awards financially support under-represented and disadvantaged exchange students.

SPECIAL THANKS TO OUR CAMPUS PARTNERS

The Sondheim Public Affairs Scholars Program awarded more than **\$40,000** to support global learning. The Honors College awarded study abroad scholarships from the Jay Freyman Foundation to **13 students**.

In Fall 2022, **18 UMBC Students** applied to the **Critical Language Scholarship and CLS Spark virtual language exchange program, supported by the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs**. The programs promote national security and international relations by increasing the number of Americans studying and mastering critical foreign languages. Among this year's applicants from UMBC:

- 1 student was selected to attend a summer intensive program in Turkey.
- 1 student was selected to study Russian language and culture through CLS Spark.
- 1 student was named a semi-finalist.

UMBC Students also apply for funding from their respective study abroad programs. In AY22-23, **6 students were awarded \$10,800 in affiliate program funding**. The Fund for Education Abroad awarded the **\$5,000 Rainbow Scholarship** to one student for their yearlong program in the United Kingdom.



For 2023-24, two UMBC alumni of the TESOL MA program received the US Department of State funded **English Language Fellows** award to lead curriculum development and teach English as a foreign language. Each award is worth approximately **\$40,000**.

Of the 2023-24 cohort of select and alternates, one is an Army veteran, five received UMBC merit scholarships, two were transfer students, and three are first- or second-generation Americans.

Funding amounts vary among grants, but Fulbright estimates the dollar value of each award to be between \$20,000 and \$22,000. As such, we can estimate that our recipients will have been funded for upwards of \$200,000. Over the past five application cycles, UMBC Fulbright recipients have been awarded more than one million dollars to fund their study, research, or teaching opportunities.





The International Student and Scholar Services (ISSS) team at the Center for Global Engagement was renamed as the **Office of International Students and Scholars (OISS)** in Fall 2022. This change represents the comprehensive advising, programming, and other services we offer, which are dedicated to supporting the academic, personal, and professional goals of the international community at UMBC.

In Spring 2023, UMBC was home to 2,390 international students and scholars, representing 99 countries on campus. Our Office oversees the entire immigration process for each student, scholar, and their dependents, including advising appointments and document processing. We also advise them on how to settle in on campus and in the Baltimore region, like getting a cell phone plan, Driver's License, a job, or internship.




This graph depicts the amount of **new H1B petitions filed** each calendar year. In 2023, 14 petitions have been filed up to June.





INFORMATION SESSIONS

OISS staff began hosting weekly Info Sessions in Spring 2023 for international students admitted for Fall 2023. General Info Sessions, held 3 times per month, cover tips on preparing students for their arrival to campus and provide an introduction to student support and resources at UMBC; Visa Prep Sessions, held once per month, cover information about the application and interview process. Before this schedule, OISS staff hosted individual sessions that attracted over 100 attendees each:



INTERNATIONAL RECRUITMENT

CGE is committed to enhancing our vibrant campus community through internationalization initiatives that align with UMBC's mission and strategic plan. This year, Adam Julian, Director of OISS, traveled to Azerbaijan, Bangladesh, and Nigeria to participate in recruitment activities with various partners. CGE staff also attended several virtual fairs; some were targeted for key regions for UMBC, such as South Asia and West Africa, while others invited prospective students from around the world. In the upcoming year, we are looking forward to expanding our recruitment travel to more markets.



GLOBALO PARTINERSIIRS

In UMBC's transition from International Education Services to a Center for Global Engagement, the support provided by Global Partnerships has been critical to this growth and development. Because all areas of Global Engagement rely on partnerships with other institutions, it can be viewed as the glue holding UMBC's Global Engagement efforts together. When done well, partnerships can empower universities like UMBC to do more with less and to build on the complementary strengths and resources of our partners.

The work of Partnerships is fundamental to the day-to-day operations and outcomes of the Center for Global Engagement. Education Abroad & Global Learning relies on a robust global network of existing partnerships with universities, study abroad providers, and other third party organizations to maintain and update its portfolio of study abroad program offerings. The English Language Institute (ELI) depends on partnerships with foreign universities, K-12 school systems, and other third party organizations in order to maintain and build enrollment. Special Programs is a new area in the ELI portfolio and is particularly reliant on a global network of strong partnerships in order to develop these programs. Global Partnerships also provides strong support to the Office of International Students & **Scholars** partnerships with third parties specializing in international student placement for recruitment and yield purposes.


Additionally, Global Partnerships works with an increasing number of UMBC faculty and academic departments in providing concierge service in taking a new partnership from the initial concept to a final, signed agreement. All of this work involves a breadth and depth of internal collaboration divisions, colleges, across **UMBC** departments. This year, the Partnerships team also implemented several measures to add infrastructure to the agreement process. This included building agreement templates and using DocuSign and TerraDotta to standardize the eSignature process. We are confident that with this structure, we will continue building strong partnerships in the coming year.

Global Partnerships empower universities like UMBC to do more with our resources by building on the strengths of our partners.

Externally, Global Partnerships accomplishes this work through:

- virtual meetings and training sessions
- group meetings at conferences/symposia
- day-to-day correspondence



ENGLISH LANGUAGE INSTITUTE

Despite challenges in recent years from the Covid-19 pandemic and changes to federal and international funding sources, the ELI has managed to sustain its operations and even experience growth with the support of the University.



The English Language Institute (ELI) has been a leader in Intensive English education in our region for over thirty years. During that time our IEP has seen a great deal of change, and taken many different shapes to ensure that we are reaching the demand and the goals of our students. Recent years have presented staunch challenges for international education, and English language programs were no exception.


Starting around 2015 and 2016, we started to see a shift in scholarships rates from sponsors such as the Saudi Arabian Cultural Missions, and the Government of Kuwait, leading to rapid decreases in enrollment. Afterwards, changes in administration at the federal level, as well as the on-going pandemic, nearly brought the field to a halt. With the continued support of the University, the ELI was able to keep its doors open, and has now seen growth in enrollment and revenue.

OUR ELI STUDENTS

Many students in the English Language Institute are recent high school or university graduates who hope to attend UMBC or another university in the U.S. Others are professionals taking short-term, intensive English classes to enhance their careers. We also enroll members of the Baltimore community who want to improve their English for employment or daily life in the U.S.



After graduating from the ELI, students take many paths: each semester, we send 2-4 students into undergraduate programs at UMBC, and several more into undergraduate programs at other institutions. Others attend graduate programs or return to their home countries to work.



SPECIAL PROGRAMS

As we continue to diversify the kinds of programming that the ELI and CGE can offer, we have expanded our portfolio for **Special Programming**. Special Programs are a unique advancement to our internationalization efforts because they can be tailored to the needs of various populations— ranging in size, English proficiency, length of program, or topic.

This year, we have hosted Special Programs short-term ranging from intensive English programs for international high school and university students, to federally sponsored grants for connecting international leaders and innovators with local leaders in Baltimore and Maryland. We are honored to report that the ELI and CGE have been selected to host several prestigious delegations this year. Read on to discover some accomplishments of our Special Programs this year. We are looking forward to another year of robust programs!
