This year, the Center for Global Engagement has made significant strides in various areas:

Academic Year 2023–24 was a landmark year for Education Abroad & Global Learning at UMBC! Together, we've embarked on a journey of growth, innovation, and impactful global engagement. Here's a glimpse into a few highlights:

- We launched the College of Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences (CAHSS) Global Learning Lab. This joint initiative between the CGE and the CAHSS Dean's Office created a faculty learning community dedicated to increasing student access to global learning opportunities. The cohort-style semester-long program provided a framework for faculty to exchange best practices and innovative models for integrating global learning into the curriculum.
- We expanded our Summer Study Abroad Program Portfolio: Building on our commitment to providing transformative international experiences, we have significantly expanded our summer study abroad program portfolio. From cultural immersion to international field research, these programs offer UMBC students a diverse array of opportunities to broaden their horizons and deepen their understanding of the world.
- UMBC was recognized as a **Fulbright U.S. Student Top Producing Institution!** This prestigious recognition not only underscores our commitment to fostering global citizenship but also celebrates the outstanding achievements of our students and alumni.
- UMBC student enrollment in study abroad programs grew by more than 30%.
- UMBC international exchange student enrollment more than doubled.







Scholarships for Study Abroad




The scholarship guarantees \$100,000

For the third time in five years, UMBC is named a Fulbright Top Producing Institution!

Ten UMBC Fulbright student recipients researching and teaching English abroad this year helped propel UMBC, once again, to the elite ranks of a Fulbright Top Producing Institution. The designation recognizes colleges and universities with the highest number of students selected for the Fulbright U.S. Student Program, the U.S. government's flagship international academic exchange program. UMBC first received this designation from the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs in 2019 - 2020 and again in 2020 - 2021.

"This achievement is a testament to your institution's deep commitment to international exchange," wrote Secretary of State Antony Blinken in a letter to President Valerie Sheares Ashby, congratulating her UMBC's Fulbright Top Producer designation, "and to building lasting connections between the people of the United States and the people of other countries."

"Being named a Top Producing Fulbright Institution is a tremendous honor—it not only shows the world what we already know about our amazing students, but it also lets our current students know that the **Fulbright is a realistic opportunity for them,**" says **Brian Souders, Ph.D. '09,** language, literacy, and culture, M.A.'19, TESOL. Souders has led students through the Fulbright application process as UMBC's Fulbright Program advisor for more than a decade.

Fulbright U.S. Student Program

Funding amounts vary among grants, but Fulbright estimates the dollar value of each award to be between \$20,000 and \$25,000. Over the past five application cycles, UMBC Fulbright recipients have been awarded more than one million dollars to fund their study, research, or teaching opportunities. For the AY24-25 application cycle, UMBC produced:

We welcomed the first ever **Fulbright Scholar in Residence** recipient, **Judith Bündgens Kostens** from the Institute for British and American Studies at the Goethe University in Frankfurt, Germany. In Fall 2023, they taught specialist ESL courses for the TESOL MA program as a visiting scholar/professor.

For AY24-25, **Emma Gebhard** received the **Congress-Bundestag Young Professionals Exchange Scholarship**, which awards 75 Americans and 75 Germans the opportunity to study, live, and intern in each others' countries for one year.




Despite these obstacles, the ELI has persevered—we've diversified our offerings through Special Programs tailored to international groups based on size, English proficiency, and topic. This year, our offerings ranged from short-term intensive English programs for international high school and university students to federally sponsored grants connecting global leaders with local counterparts in Baltimore and Maryland.

Our team has expanded to include an additional Graduate Assistant and the inaugural Assistant Director of Special Programs, plus various short-term staff with language proficiencies to meet the varying needs of our program participants. This summer, UMBC's Center for Global Engagement is excited to welcome its second cohort of the prestigious Mandela Washington Fellowship for Young African Leaders, the six-week flagship program of the U.S. Government's Young African Leaders Initiative (YALI). The new cohort includes **25 innovators from countries across Sub-Saharan Africa representing education, journalism, tech, health care, and more**. The fellows will spend six weeks living at UMBC networking and attending diversity and leadership skills workshops. They will also meet with campus, local, and state leaders, learn more about Baltimore's LGBTQ+ leaders of color, developmental disabilities at The ARC Baltimore, trauma-informed practices, and more.

"The fellowship is a beacon of hope," says Jok Thon, M.P.S. '24, entrepreneurship, innovation, and leadership, a 2018 University of Delaware YALI fellow and UMBC's first Global Peaceworker Fellow. Thon is a father of four and the director and founder of Promised Land Primary and Secondary School and Promised Land College in Juba, South Sudan, which has educated over 1500 displaced students. "As a witness and participant in this transformative experience, I wholeheartedly attest the journey is as profound for the mentors as it is for the fellows."

These 700 spots across 28 U.S. educational institutions are considered a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity, for both fellows and host institutions, to strengthen connections between the U.S. and Africa and establish enduring partnerships between fellows, local communities, and private businesses through their expertise, perspectives, and experiences. "YALI is a huge deal in my country and Africa. It's a journey I want to take with my whole community, nation, and the world," says 2023 UMBC YALI fellow Victoria Merab Akinyi. She is the CEO and co-founder of Streetlights Uganda, a visual and performing arts-based organization empowering children living on the streets with entrepreneurship and life skills to become self-employed and engaged citizens.

Explains the services and processes for working with the OGP to host a campus visit and resource for partnership development







Intercultural Engagement Prep

In partnership with the Shriver Center, the Center for Global Engagement launched a new pilot program in the Spring of 2024.



99

20 undergraduate and 6 graduate students

participated in the first pilot semester of Intercultural Engagement Prep

What is Intercultural Engagement Prep?

This program offers intercultural citizenship education over the course of a semester in a hybrid, self paced non-credit PRAC format. As a successor of the UMBC Peace Corps Prep program, it aims to prepare students with the **skills**, **knowledge**, **and attitudes applicable to future study abroad**, **Fulbright**, **international internship**, **or Peace Corps experiences**.

The program is open to both undergraduate and graduate students. The first cohort included **8 international students**, who cited the **cultural adjustment training** as a benefit of the course.

The pilot semester focused on the topics of **enhancing cultural self-awareness** and **reinforcing intercultural dialogue** and culminated with the presentation of students' portfolio presentations as a showcase of their work. Students have commented on how the applied nature of the program allowed them to be intentional about **developing their intercultural skills in real life situations.**
